The Former Yugoslavia-Born Community in Victoria

The Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia (FYROM) became an independent state in 1991 and was categorised as a birthplace country for the first time in the 1996 Census. The population of FYROM had originated from the wider Macedonian region and from northern Greece. Census statistics based on country of origin do not reflect the number of Macedonians in Australia. They have had a long settlement history, arriving in waves since the early 20th Century, and in increasing numbers to meet labour shortages during the post World War II boom in Australia in the 1960s and 1970s.

At the 2006 Census, there were 18,319 FYROM-born persons in Victoria (45.1% of Australia's total), decreasing by 6.3% from 19,560 persons in 2001, partly due to the ageing of the population. Over two-thirds (69.7%) had arrived prior to 1986. The FYROM-born community was distributed throughout metropolitan Melbourne, with distinct concentrations in Whittlesea (30.7%) and Brimbank (20.4%). There were 37,433 persons who identified with Macedonian ancestry, including second and later generations.


The FYROM-born community showed an older age profile: 49.4% were aged between 45 and 64 years and 16.4% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 51 years, compared to 37 years for the total Victorian population. There were 104 males to 100 females. Most of the community spoke Macedonian at home (82.6%); 8.1% spoke Albanian; and 5.9% spoke English only. A relatively large percentage (26.7%) assessed themselves as speaking English not well or not at all. Over half (57.0%) followed the Macedonian Orthodox faith; 20.0% were Eastern Orthodox (not further defined); 9.9% were Muslim; and 5.7% were Greek Orthodox. Most (93.1%) held Australian Citizenship, compared to 67.5% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.




