There has been a long history of immigration to Australia from the region formerly known as the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. Since the Balkan wars of the 1990s, this region now covers the states of Slovenia, Croatia, Macedonia, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Serbia, Montenegro and Kosovo. Serbia was recorded as a separate birthplace group for the first time in the 2006 Census, and therefore, no data comparisons are available with previous censuses, unlike the other fact sheets in this series.

At the 2006 Census, there were 6,035 Serbia-born persons in Victoria (38.5% of Australia's total). Although the community was distributed throughout metropolitan Melbourne, there were distinct concentrations in the outer suburbs of Brimbank (13.2%); Greater Dandenong (12.7%); and Casey (9.8%). There were 29,594 persons who identified with Serbian ancestry, attributed to the large number of second and subsequent generations.

The Serbia-born community showed an older age profile: 27.1% were aged 26-44 years; 39.1% were aged 45-64 years; and 18.8% were aged 65 years and over. The median age was 48 years, compared to 37 years for the total Victorian population. There was gender balance, with 99 males to 100 females. The majority (71.1%) spoke Serbian at home; 6.8% spoke Albanian; 3.1% spoke Hungarian; and 8.3% spoke English only. A significant proportion (18.3%) assessed themselves as speaking English not well or not at all. Almost half (47.9%) of the Serbia-born followed the Serbian Orthodox religion; 15.1% followed a variety of Eastern Orthodox faiths; and 5.4% were Muslims. Most (91.0%) of the Serbia-born held Australian Citizenship, compared to 67.5% for the total overseas-born population in Victoria.




